## MEMBER PROFILE - GREG TUCKER

Like most club members I had a love for cars and bikes from a very young age. My Dad always had nice cars, bought new, and always kept immaculate. On school holidays I was shipped off to my Aunt and Uncle's home in Maungaturoto. Uncle Colin owned the garage there, and allowed me to free range around all the old bikes and cars which planted the seed for my love of vehicles.

My first car was a 1974 Ford Escort panel van, with a whole 1200cc of power. I had just started work with the Post Office as a field technician working on phone lines in the Whangarei area. The van cost me \$4200 and took me two years to pay off. Of course, I customised it with mags and fat tyres, spoilers, a new paint job and a custom interior in pure 80's gold crushed velvet. I had many fun years with that van in the 80's, going to custom van shows and being part of the Northland Knights Custom Van Club.

Next, off road buggies caught my eye, and I bought a kit set frame and started building a two seated off roader. I was lucky enough to find a rolled VW Beetle to use as a donor vehicle. I look back now and think it was almost criminal to dismantle an early oval window Beetle. They just weren't worth much at that point in time.

The 1200cc motor and gearbox was removed and installed in the buggy, along with the front end steering and suspension. I raced the buggy for a couple of years with the Whangarei Off-Road Club. I didn't win any prizes with the 1200cc motor, but had a lot of fun trying! Of course, a Ford Falcon was bought to tow the off-roader around, and the Escort van was traded in to pay for it.



Then came marriage and children and I had to become a sensible/responsible parent. The off-roader was sold for a pop-top camper (which I still have) and the Falcon was sold as it was too hungry with gas. A run of cars followed the Falcon; Hondas, Toyotas and different work vehicles.

As the family grew to four children I had to upsize to a Mitsubishi L300 Sports Pac van to get the whole family around. I kept that van for around 15 more years. It was a great vehicle that the family used every day and for holidays. By the time I had sold it, all the children had learned to drive in it and then left home. I have wonderful memories with this van.

By this stage in life I had moved into management roles for Chorus, Downers, and currently Northpower Fibre that supplied a full use vehicle. The L300 was sold as it had served it's purpose. I bought my first road bike, a Honda 250, which quickly upgraded to a Honda VFR 800. I have since owned a Triumph Thunderbird 1200, Triumph Tiger 800, Honda 300 Rally and a raft of off-road bikes; a Honda 200 racing trike, Yamaha 400 racing quad and Kawasaki 300 KLX (and possibly more).

The shed was built on the back of my place in Maunu. Rae and I retired, and I started looking for a project to keep me busy. With my previous experience with the VW's they became the obvious choice. We lucked upon a 1970 VW Kombi bay window camper van that was a promotional vehicle for Simply Squeezed juice company where Rae's brother-in-law was working at the time. I spent the next few years improving the performance and handling of this old van; twin carbs were added, new matching tyres, a heavy-duty sway bar and new disc brakes on the front wheels. Also new canvas for the pop-top and a few other bits and pieces. It's a great vehicle to take to shows and on VW runs, plus it has the original Westfalia camping fit out that we use fairly regularly (although the interior is fairly "cosy"). Along with the crazy paint job done by the juice company, the van came with it's personalised plates (VANSSA) and some great documentation of it's history. Built and fitted out in Germany she was driven around Europe and the Middle East before being shipped out to Dunedin a few months later. We have records of services done in Istanbul and Teheran, along with original insurance documents.

Once the Kombi was at a level I was happy with I looked for a new project. A New Zealand built 1969 VW Beetle was found by word of mouth. It needed quite a bit of work done on it, and took me over two years to strip down and rebuild. A new motor, reconditioned gearbox, rust removed, new suspension, new paint and interior refurbishment. A lot of work was done over the Covid period, which meant that I had the time, but it was difficult to get parts from overseas. The Beetle was back on the road by the end of 2021 and Rae loves to drive it way more than me.

I was hoping to do a kit car for my next project, and had my eye on a Porsche 356 kit online. The donor car was an MGF and I found a 1996 MGF on Trade Me that came with another parts car for a great price. It turned out that the 'good' car was too good to pull apart, and the parts car was too far gone to be used as a donor chassis, so after stripping all the parts I could possibly need, one car was dumped and the other driven (after a little bit of work). So, if anyone is interested, there's an MGF with lots of spare parts that needs to be moved for my next project ..... that's the trouble with having a big shed and too many toys!

After joining the club and discussions with some of the other members, Brian mentioned that he had a Triumph TR6 (in pieces) for sale that required a lot of work to be put back together. This looked like a great project and a big challenge for me as I don't have any experience or knowledge on old British cars. A deal was struck and I picked up the chassis and body from Hikurangi and the parts from Brian's place.

I'm really looking forward to the challenge of restoring this 1974 TR6, and will hopefully be able to bring it on club outings within a couple of years.

## **NORTHPORT VISIT - 5th March 2025**

We did the tour round Northport in two groups, one before lunch, lunch together at the Ruakaka Tavern with both groups, then group two going round in the afternoon.

We were taken round in a Minibus driven by a lovely chap who had worked there for eleven years. Northport started off basically as a wood product port - and boy was there a lot of wood there! A ship called "Warrior" was being loaded while we were there - huge ship, and our guide described the logistics of how it was done. Cement from Golden Bay Cement and prefab cabins were the next export Northport took on as log exports waned. Finally containers were taken on and the special ten million dollar crane required for them was purchased, they now have two of them. As many Northlanders probably know Northport has been trying to get permission to dredge out more of the harbour so they can expand the container aspect of the port to take over some of the Ports of Auckland container trade as Auckland is at full capacity and trying to expand which a lot of Aucklanders don't want. Northport has a lot of land they own which would easily give them the room for expansion.

Of course, Northport's latest venture is providing berthing for Cruise Liners coming to Whangarei, using coaches to transport passengers to Whangarei for sightseeing. It was a fascinating insight into the workings of a port which most of us would never get to see, so thanks very much to the club for organising this outing. (report by Judy Pothan)






